As it turns out, the narrator is writing his apologia from a prison cell (he is to be tried for murder). As far as erotic detail is concerned, the book tells little that has not been dealt with in a lot of bestselling fiction; but where the sexy bestsellers talk about the sordid or tragic facts of life in staccato sociology, couch jargon or four-letter words, Lolita is the more shocking because it is both intensely lyrical and wildly funny. It is (in many of its pages) a Medusa's head with trick paper snakes, and its punning comedy, as well as its dark poetics, will disappoint the smut hounds—a solemn breed.

Lolita, the critic concluded, wasn't merely a book worthy of publication despite its subject matter—it was a work of literature with something to teach the world.

The way he has portrayed both the prime characters of the novel has made them alive forever. It is an absolute privilege to read 'Lolita' in a lifetime. 'I am thinking of aurochs and angels, the secret of durable pigments, prophetic sonnets, the refuge of art. And this is the only immortality you and I may share, my Lolita.'— epilogue".
