




WHAT IS THE NEED FOR CBE?

It is similar to mastery-based learning, with the primary difference being that competency-based learning often focuses on observable skills or 'competencies,' while mastery learning may be academic—as likely to focus on concepts as skills. In the competitive world, there is an urgent need to develop CBE by empowering the teachers in getting proper training on latest pedagogies, adaptive assessment to optimize learning and development of all. Learners to be assessed on the basis of competencies like ability to reason, critical thinking, values, attitudes and concerns etc. When we evaluate the drawing based on certain themes, we apply certain criteria to make the judgement in the same way learning outcome also be evaluated using criteria which should be informed to the students well in advance. A clear move should be made from knowledge acquisition to knowledge application, from single measure objective to multiple measurable objectives, from proxy assessment to performance based Assessment is a meaningful, positive, and empowering learning experience for students that yields timely, relevant, and actionable evidence. Students learn actively using different pathways and varied

pacing. Rigorous, common expectations for learning (knowledge, skills, and dispositions) are explicit, transparent, measurable, and transferable. Learners to be assessed on the basis of competencies like ability to reason, critical thinking, values, attitudes and concerns etc. Assessment is embedded throughout and may look different for each student according to their achievement level. Learning outcomes consist of deep understanding and application of content to new situations. Student performance is determined by individual growth and mastery. 
