After so many years of battle eventually the judgment was given by the Supreme Court in September 2018 making Section 377on the Indian Penal Code legal. 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The above table shows that most of the transgender people did not suffer from mental health problems.16.7% of Trans thought about committing suicide in their life time. About 6.7% have felt stress. Depression and loneliness has the same percentage at 3.3% and 1.7% experienced tension/angry.

All the transgender have common problems. These problems include social problems, Psychological problems, marketing problems, bureaucratic problems, knowledge problems gender and other issues problems, financial constraint issues and entrepreneurship problems.
