In Karnataka, the Department of Collegiate Education started in the year 1960 having 430 government first Grade Colleges that includes 355 co-education colleges, 53 girls' colleges, 06 law colleges, 14 residential colleges, 02 chitra kala colleges and 02 Model college, and 14 Engineering 87 Polytechnic colleges, 321 private aided colleges across the state with the help of 6 regional offices located at Bangalore, Mysore, Mangalore, Shimoga, Dharwad, and Gulbarga.

It is interesting to note that the names of several prominent academicians of post-independence years like Dr. Sarvapalli Radhakrishnan and Sri. Lakshminarayana Modaliar of post-independence years are associated with the Department as recommendations of committees chaired by them have played a key role in establishing it. The expansion chaired Department is equally impressive when referred back to its modest beginning with mere 44 colleges. The Department has contributed immensely to the development of Higher Education in Karnataka.

The Study reveals that the hiring intent has almost doubled after a steep decline in 2020. The intent was at 15 percent in 2019, down to 10 percent in 2020, and currently stands at 19 percent in 2021.
