Francis Bacon, for instance, claimed in *The Advancement of Learning* (1605) that facial expressions and body gestures not only betray one's mood but also one's state of mind and intent. This allows for the generalization of the nature and propensities of the mind (Richard, 2020)

Particularly as testing techniques have gotten more rigorous, scores that are much higher than chance are rather uncommon (Britannica, 2013)

When a psychic communication is transmitted and received at different times, it's called *latent telepathy*. *Precognitive telepathy* refers to the paranormal ability of a telepath to predict the mental state of another person in the near or far future. (James, 1981)

Contrary to supernatural talents like precognition, there aren't many examples of telepathy in any ancient nations' records. Despite the prevalence of prophecy and precognition in primitive and ancient societies, there is minimal documentation of people communicating between the minds. When the concept of telepathy does surface, it usually takes the form of "dream telepathy," in which people communicate while they are dreaming, prayers telepathy in which people communicate while they are doing their prayers. Democritus, a Greek philosopher, proposed the first physical explanation of dream telepathy, according to

which, through the pores of a dreamer, emotionally charged pictures might be projected by living things and transferred to a dreamer. (James, 1990)

Mesmerism, in which patients would exhibit telepathic powers and follow out unspoken commands, is where research interest in telepathy first emerged. Psychologists like Carl Jung and Sigmund Freud noted telepathic experiences, and William James, a psychologist and philosopher, pushed for deeper study of the phenomenon. (Hansel, 1966)

The Society for Psychical Research's early studies are widely acknowledged as having launched the western scientific inquiry of telepathy. The Society's research into telepathy was contained in a two-volume book titled *Phantasms of the Living* that was released in 1886. The majority of the evidence was obtained through stories, follow-up inquiries, and studies on purported telepaths. However, by the standards of modern science, the experimental techniques were lax. (Hansel, 1989)

Elon Musk, an American billionaire, will move humans to a quantum leap in telepathic communication by implanting a chip in the brain and linking it to artificial intelligence, through which electronic devices can be controlled through thinking, and this chip can be linked between people and telepathy occurs.

The chip was actually placed on a monkey. Elon Musk showed video footage to the media of a monkey with a computer chip in its brain playing "telepathic video games".
