Values differ from person to person and from one society to another society. It represents the judgmental aspects that reflects person’s thoughts, ideas, behaviors, beliefs. Values are mainly stem from social and cultural mores. The **Kothari Commission** also known as **National Education Commission 1964** provide necessary suggestions to upgrade the quality of the then existing education system of the country. The commission also laid stress upon the formation of proper character of the students and their adequate inculcation of moral and spiritual values through appropriate strategies at all levels of education.

Definition of Value

T.W. Hippi defined value as “Values are conscious or unconscious motivators and justifiers of the actions and judgement”.

H. M. Johnson defined value as “Values are general standards and may be regarded as higher order norms.”

According to the sociologist **Durkheim**, values are important in regulating the disruptive passions of individuals.

Concept of Spiritual, Moral and Ethical Values

- **Spiritual Value:**

These are the integrative values based on faith of the individual. These values help in spiritual growth and development of the individual. Such as integrity, honesty, goodness, mannerism, simplicity, truthfulness.

M. Imomnazarov defined spirituality as “Spirituality is the divine light in the human heart.” According to him, spirituality appears as light of truth that continues to reflect in the human heart which represents the mirror of human soul.

T. Mahmudov defined spirituality to be a concept embracing a certain degree of individuals’ physical, mental, moral perspectives, spiritual maturity and also their views about the world.

A. Erkaev believed spirituality to be an important integral unity of various original qualities and attributes of human beings that represents the essence of socio-cultural being. These include qualities like honesty, conscience, justice, kindness, patriotism, love of beauty, righteous, pleasure, loyalty.

According to **Vedanta**, the human soul constitutes of fives Koshas namely:

- a. **Annamaya**
- b. **Pranamaya**
- c. **Manomaya**
- d. **Vigyanamaya**
- e. **Anandmaya**

It is believed that when individual goes beyond the bondage of any of these five koshas, it is possible to attain higher and deeper level of knowledge by him. Such knowledge tends to facilitate individual's performance in any social and religious affairs and also in the development of different human values. Therefore, spirituality enables all to develop adequate awareness about the necessity of core essential values.

▪ **Moral Value:**

These values help individuals to take right decisions based on mainly ethics. These represents some principles but not any rule. Moral values moderate actions and decisions of individuals. Such as honesty, loyalty, compassion, responsibility.

In the words of **Aristotle**, moral value means a disposition that enable individual to behave in a proper and right way. According to him, moral values are certain virtues that acted as a mean existing between the extremes of deficiency and excess which constitute the vices.

The word '**morality**' is derived from the Latin word '**moralis**' meaning customs, character, and manner. (**Earle, 1992:178**). According to **Sternberg (1994:938)**, moral values are concerned with good or right things in people's relationship with each other. **Carol K. Sigelman** believed that moral values constitute of three basic components. These are:

- a. **An Affective or Emotional Component** (feelings of individual about good or bad, vice and virtues)
- b. **A Cognitive Component** (Individuals conceptualization about how to behave in a right manner)
- c. **A Behavioural Component** (reflecting right or wrong behaviour of the individuals)

According to **Socrates**, morality is associated with thought of the individual. Moral values are the virtues of knowing about what refers to good and thereby putting that proper knowledge in actual practice.

▪ **Ethical Values:**

The word '**ethics**' has been derived from the Greek word '**ethos**' meaning character or conduct. Ethical values are the values that govern actions and decisions based on the functions of individuals' moral beliefs. These values reflect an individual sense of good or bad, right, or wrong.

According to **Dewey**, the core subject-matter of ethics is to point out what is good and right in conduct of an individual.

G. E. Moore considers supreme good as subject-matter of ethics.

Mackenzie opined ethics to be a general study of ideals that are involved in human life.

In the words of **Muirhead**, Ethics is not only concerned with the individuals' temporal behaviour but also it forms the basis of their legal decision.

Importance of Values in 21st century

1. **Integrating healthy social relationships effectively:** This may help students to develop effective and controlled communication strategies. Healthy social relationships help students to reduce stress, anxiety and depression and thereby tends to support better mental health.
2. **Building up society for better living and peaceful co-existence:** Values are necessary in order to maintain peace in the society. Values enable students to develop certain human qualities so that they can able to bring and maintain stability and integrity in the society by resolving various conflicts.

7. **Increasing motivation of the students in any productive activity:** Due to the lack of sufficient motivation, students often perform poorly in many activities. Proper value inculcation is necessary to bring motivation of the students so that they can adjust, adapt and accommodate effectively for the wellbeing of all in the society.
8. **Affecting students' perceptions greatly:** By influencing perceptions of the students, values determine a students' potentialities to function productively. Values also enable students to tackle their needs and problems purposefully.
9. **Controlling the improper attitude and behavior of the individuals:** values are required to control the disruptive behavior of the students within the society. Both the formal and non-formal organizations must inculcate necessary values among the students so that they may understand their role and responsibility as a member of the society.
10. **Enabling individual to interact with others harmoniously and reducing social problem:** Fostering values tends to facilitate students to develop good interpersonal skills that enable them to interact with others effectively. Students with proper values may also able to reduce various forms of social problems that destroy the harmony and integrity in the society.

Causes of value degradation among students

1. **Disoriented and disorganized family structure** fails to infuse values among the children. Families exhibiting such character often develop poor bond with their children and hence, children display disorganized behavior and unhealthy attitude.
2. **Lack of consciousness and ignorance** among parents regarding proper development of values within children. These are responsible for poor value development among students.
3. **Adverse influence of social media** among the students are also responsible for value deterioration in present days. Social media by promoting negative experiences hamper necessary value inculcation among the students. excessive use of social media may possess an increased risk for more erosion of values among students as it tends to enhance anxiety, stress, depression, identity crisis within students.
4. **Improper parental attitude and behavior** affects value inculcation among children. Unhealthy attitude, poor bonding, low affection by parents towards children may also hinders fostering of essential human values among them.
5. **Faulty education system** fails to inculcate proper values among students. defective system of education at various level may termed to be another major factor that hampers value development among the students. In the contemporary situation, emphasis must be given more on learner-centered approach.
6. **Lack of appropriate curriculum** of the prevailing education system at all levels. The present curriculum must include value-based education so that both the teachers and students may get conscious about the necessity of core values for peaceful existence within the society.
7. **Presence of gender-bias, violence, greed, class conflict, isolation, unrest, antisocial behavior, dirty politics and various sorts of corruptions** within the society. Presence of such unethical practices greatly affect the process of value development among the students and therefore, students are becoming more prone to lead more disturbed and unhealthy living conditions.
8. **Modernization and materialistic way of living** hamper the development of proper values. In present times, individuals prefer to adopt the traits of modernization and often feel satisfied in leading materialistic way of living. Such life-style fails to inculcate essential core human values effectively within individuals specially among the students. Hence, students are becoming arrogant, desperate, dishonest, indiscipline in their attitude and behavior.
9. **Privatization of educational institutions:** Most of the educational institutions are becoming profit-making organizations that tend to transform education into business. Hence, they are least bothered regarding the development of proper values among students.
10. **Lack of positive learning environment:** Positive and healthy learning environment also enable students to learn values from the schools and other formal agencies of learning. Lack of such condition hampers fostering of values among them and therefore, students are not able to develop various essential life skills properly.

11. **Lack of discipline, identity crisis and arrogance:** These are also responsible for degeneration of values among the students of 21st century. As a result of these, students fail to adequately adjust and function productively within the society.
12. **Rapid rate of unfavorable economic change:** In present times, due to the rapid economic fluctuations, the education system also gets adversely affected. Such situation leads to the privatization of the educational institutions that holds profit-making attitude instead of taking care of the long-term development of the academic institutions.

Suggestive Measures

1. **Proper guidance and control** of children by parents is extremely needed in order to curb their disapproving attitude.
2. **Increasing awareness** about the importance of values among the parents is required so that they may foster necessary human values to their children at very early stage of socialization.

7. Teachers at various level of education must play a **role-model** to foster values among students.
