Zhou et al. Financial assistance claimed the second rank 2, highlighting its substantial importance. The respondents recognize the critical role of the scholarship in providing financial support. Promoting education for girls secured the third rank 3, underscoring its notable importance. Encouraging higher education obtained the fourth rank 4, indicating a recognition of its importance but possibly not as critical as other factors. Empowering women received the lowest total score and was ranked fifth 5. While still recognized, respondents placed less emphasis on this factor compared to others.

SUGGESTION

- > Increasing awareness through community outreach programs, workshops, and information sessions to ensure that eligible candidates are well-informed about the scholarship.
- Making it easier for people to obtain information and submit their applications by improving online application processes and offering digital tools to assist applicants
- > Improving communication channels to provide regular updates and information to applicants, and ensuring transparency in the application process.
- > Boosting the amount of money given to the scholarship program to expand its beneficiary base and improve the level of financial assistance given to each participant.

> Putting in place mentorship programs to offer advice and assistance to scholarship recipients, assisting them in overcoming obstacles and choosing their educational and professional pathways.
