CBSE Udaan Scheme: The CBSE Udaan Scheme is an initiative by the Central Board of Secondary Education to encourage disadvantaged girl students to pursue higher education particularly in engineering and science related fields. This scheme aims to increase girls admission in prestigious engineering and technical education across India.

State Government Schemes

Ladli Laxmi Yojana: This scheme is a Government initiative primarily in Madhya Pradesh and also implemented in sGoa designed to empower girls by providing financial assistance for their education and welfare. Laxmi Yojana aims to improve the status of girls and children in society and promote their education.

Maazi Kanya Bhagyashree Scheme: The Maazi Kanya Bhagyasree Yojana is a Government initiative in Maharashtra, India. Designed to benefit girl child support of financial assistance to girl children from below poverty line families.

Bhagyashree Yonana : The Karnataka state Government initiative Bhagyashree Yojana or scheme is a welfare program designed to promote the birth of girl children in economically weaker families and provide financial assistance for their health and education.

Kanyashree Prakalpa Scheme: The Kanyashree prakalpa Scheme is launched by government of West Bengal in a conditional cash transfer program designed to improve the status and well-being of Adolescent Girls by Incentivizing them to continue their education and postponed marriage until at least 18 years of age.
