By age 25, in 2004, he became the youngest Member of the Karnataka Legislative Assembly (MLA) from Shorapur, elected on a Kannada Nadu Party ticket.

In 2011, he was appointed as the Minister for Small Scale Industries in the Karnataka cabinet, where he worked to support entrepreneurship and boost local economic activity.

Ministerial Leadership:

After his second electoral victory (this time on a BJP ticket), he served as the Minister for Small Scale Industries in the Karnataka government from 2011 to 2013.

Focus on Infrastructure and Water Development

One of Raju Gowda's most significant areas of impact has been infrastructure and water resource development. Understanding the acute shortage of clean drinking water in his constituency, he championed several large-scale initiatives:

Krishna River Drinking Water Project: Launched in 2021, this ₹158.8 crore project supplies water to Shorapur and nearby villages, designed to meet the region's needs up to 2055. The project fulfilled a decades-old demand for a reliable drinking water source.

Jaladhare Scheme: A ₹2,004 crore rural drinking water mission, aimed at providing water to hundreds of villages in Shorapur, Shahapur, Hunsagi, and other taluks in Yadgir district.

AMRUT Phase II Projects: With funding of ₹310 crore, urban areas in the region are benefiting from upgraded water supply systems, sewerage, and basic infrastructure under the Atal Mission for Rejuvenation and Urban Transformation.

Road and Drainage Works: Under his leadership, Shorapur saw the implementation of key infrastructure projects worth ₹31 crore, including a 45-kilometer road stretch and modern drainage systems to improve urban living standards.

Leadership in State Infrastructure Planning

Since 2020, Shri Narasimha Nayak has served as the Chairman of the Karnataka Urban Water Supply and Drainage Board (KUWSDB). In this capacity, he has overseen the execution of urban and rural water supply projects across the state. He also advocated for projects such as the Hale Unduwadi drinking water project for Mysuru and surrounding areas, ensuring that long-term sustainability and modern technology remain central to state water policy.

Notably, under his leadership, Karnataka initiated the installation of 4,400 SCADA-controlled irrigation gates—a first-of-its-kind move in India—designed to improve irrigation efficiency in the Narayanpur Left Bank Canal system.

Electoral Journey and Continued Public Engagement

Although Raju Gowda has faced electoral defeats in 2013, 2023, and the 2024 by-election, his political relevance has remained intact due to his active engagement in developmental work and his consistent presence in local governance. His career reflects resilience, a deep understanding of regional issues, and an emphasis on long-term solutions rather than short-term populism.

Recent Roles & Continued Influence:

Although he lost the 2013 election, he reclaimed his seat in a 2018 victory.

In 2020, he was appointed Chairman of the Karnataka Urban Water Supply & Drainage Board, positioning him at the helm of critical urban infrastructure management.

He also held a key organizational role as State President of the BJP ST Morcha from 2016 to 2020, demonstrating leadership within the party's tribal wing.
