Technical and Vocational Education

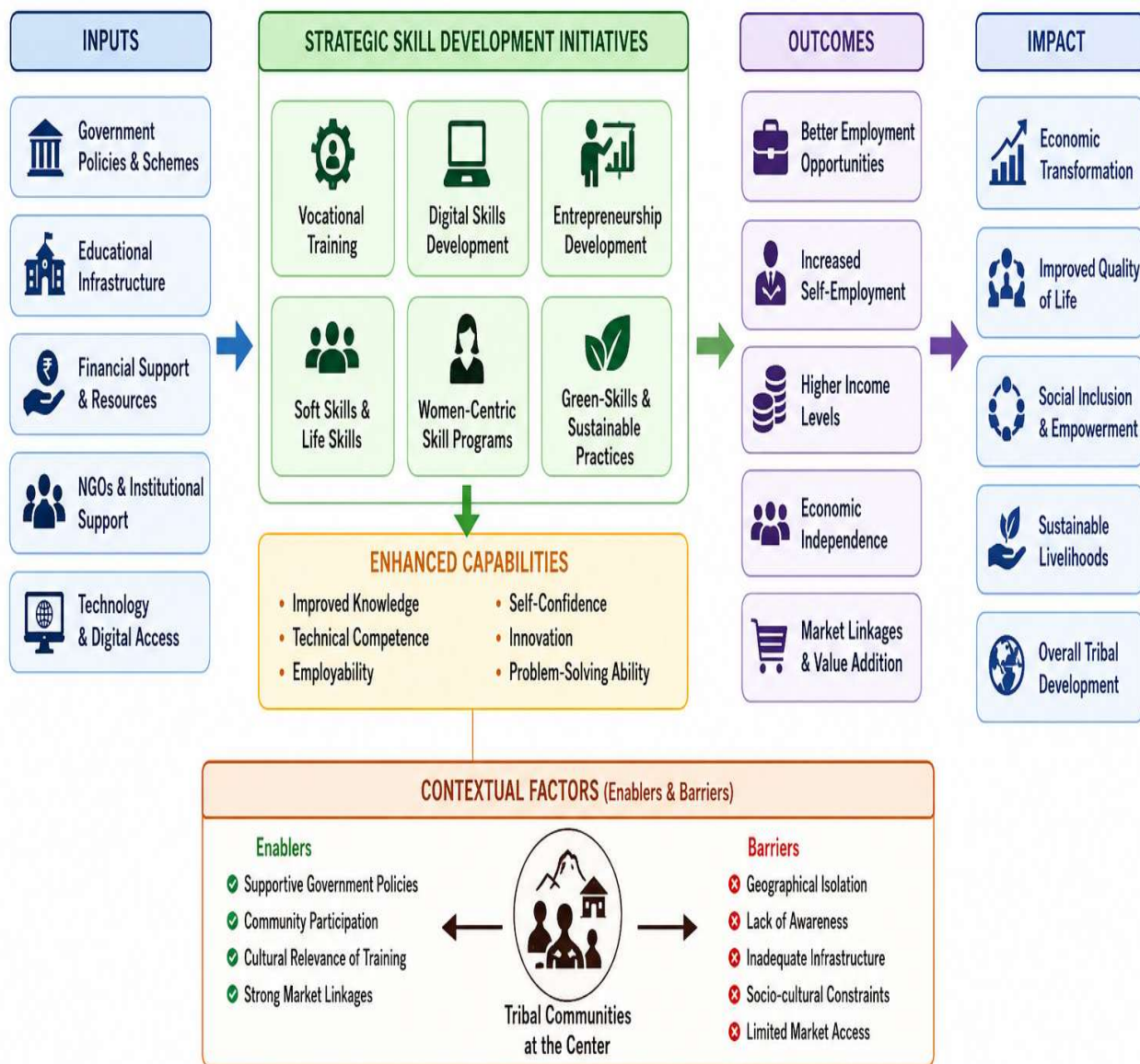

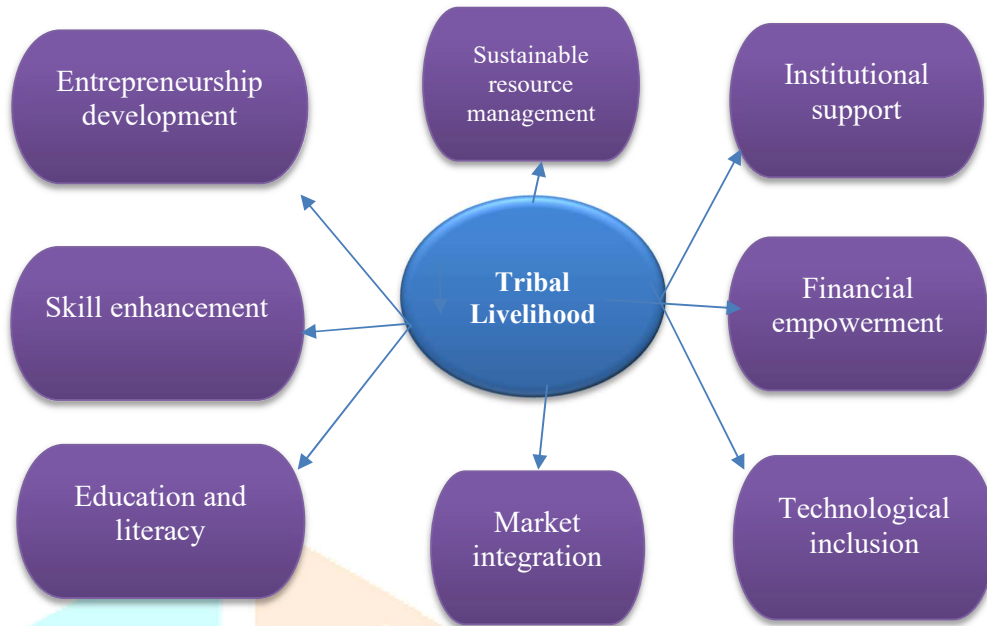
1. Concept of Tribal Livelihood Transformation

Conceptual Framework: Economic Transformation of Tribal Livelihoods through Strategic Skill Development Initiatives



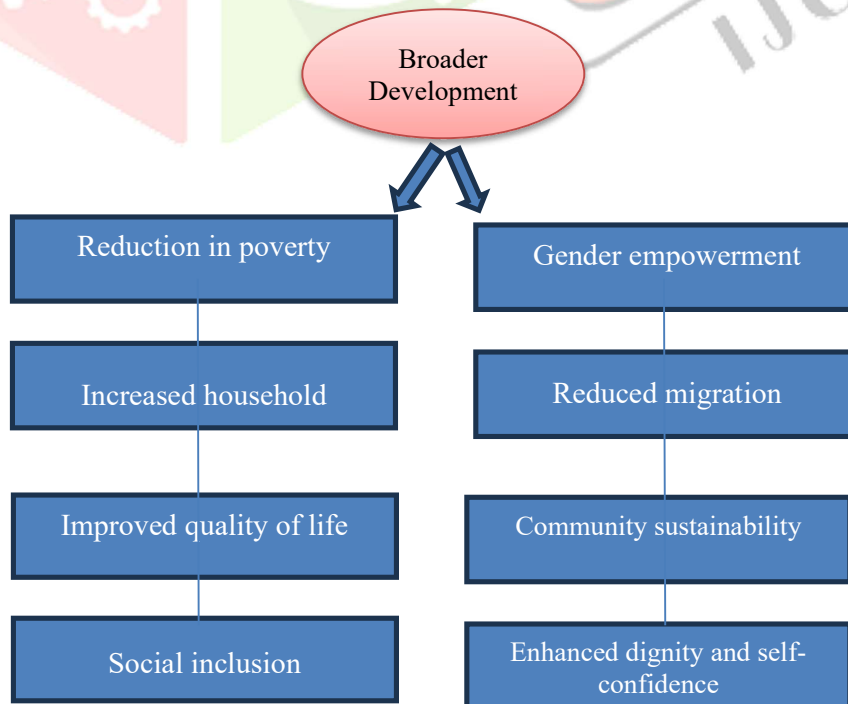

4.Strategic Skill Development Initiatives

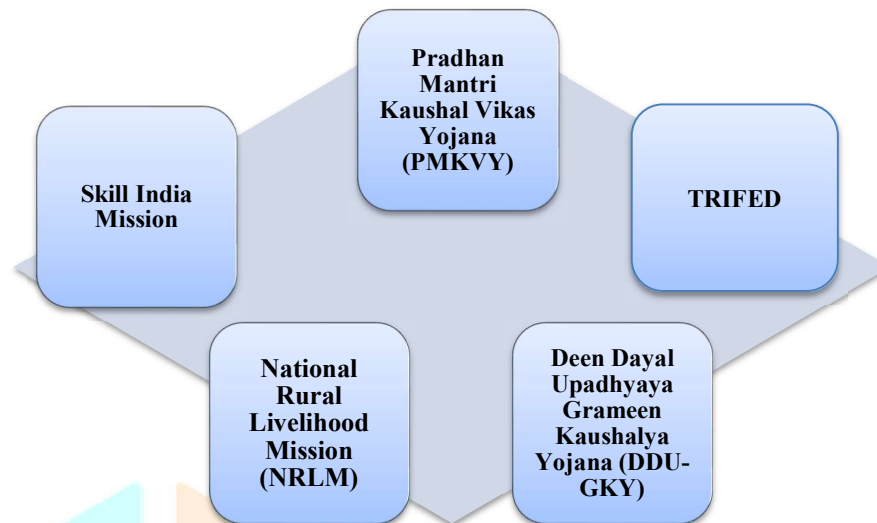
