Since it is located at the northwest of the Western Ghats and the westernmost edge of the Eastern Ghats, it supports a diverse flora and fauna because of the various habitats present.

It is a pilgrimage site and derives its name from the Rangaswamy Temple located on top of a white cliff. The Temple is dedicated to Lord Ranganatha and the festivity in this temple during April attracts a lot of tourists. The region boasts a variety of vegetation ranging from the dry and deciduous to evergreens. The Wildlife Sanctuary borders with the Sathyamangalam Wildlife Sanctuary and is home to gaurs, bears, sambhar, tigers, leopards, wild dogs, and elephants. It is also home to more than 200 bird species and the best time to visit the B R Hills place is from June to December.

The wildlife sanctuary is 35 km long north-south and 15 km wide east-west, is spread over an area of 540 Sq km with a wide variation in mean temperature of 9 °C to 16 °C min and 20 °C to 38 °C max, and annual rainfall is 600 mm at the base and 3000 mm at the top of the hills station, and hill ranges, within the sanctuary, rise as high as 1200 m above the basal plateau of 600 m and run north–south in two ridges. The wide range of climatic conditions along with the altitude variations within the small area of the sanctuary have translated it into a highly heterogeneous mosaic of habitats such that we find almost all major forest vegetation types- scrub, deciduous, riparian, evergreen, sholas, and grasslands. During in January month. Relative humidity ranges from 69 to 85% in the morning and in the evening it ranges from 21% to 70%. The wind speed ranges from 8.4 to 14.1 Kmph. June to September is the southwest monsoon period, October and November is the post-monsoon retreating monsoon season with clear bright weather and during December to February, weather remains dry.

About the Religious Temple of Biligiri Ranganatha Swamy

The B R hills are located at the north-west of the Western Ghats and the westernmost edge of the Eastern Ghats. This area is supports a diverse flora and fauna given the various habitat types present. A wildlife sanctuary of 322.4 square kilometers (124.5 sq mi) was created around the temple on 27 June 1974, and enlarged to 539.52 square kilometers (208.31 sq mi) on 14 January 1987. The sanctuary derives its name Biligiri (white hill in Kannada) from the white rock face that constitutes the major hill crowned with the temple of Lord Ranganathaswamy (Lord Vishnu) or from the white mist and the silver clouds that cover these

hills for a greater part of the year. An annual festival of Lord Vishnu, held in April, draws pilgrims from far and wide. Once in two years, the Soliga Tribals present a 1-foot and 9-inch slipper, made of skin, to the deity in Biligiriranga Hills.

1. To Analyze the Tourists and Infrastructure Facilities in the B R Hills Study Area.


Methodology
