In West Bengal's rural libraries, jobseekers and students frequently use public libraries and career guidance sections for exam prep due to limited private means, stressing the civic importance of public libraries in these regions ([De Gruyter Brill]). Some libraries have established dedicated sections for competitive exam materials and even offer coaching sessions or workshops (Bansal, 2022).

Research indicates that regular library users tend to perform better in competitive exams due to better access to resources and a conducive study environment (Kumar, 2019). Libraries also help bridge the digital divide by providing internet access and digital literacy training. The role of libraries is evolving with the integration of technology. Different kinds of test, mock papers, and quizzes are held each week in the library to make studies more pleasant to the students. Also, library has its page on Face book where they conduct online quizzes and share valuable content for aspirants.”(Sahariya, 2017).
